




One of the interesting aspects of the Holy Triduum services, the services of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter is that the services on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday do not end with a dismissal. In some ways, this can make leaving the services uncomfortable. It might leave us asking, "Is it over? Have we seen what we came to see?"


The reason that there is not a dismissal at the end of the Maundy Thursday or Good Friday services is that it is not over. The story cannot be over until Easter. These three services are actually to be taken as one extended service in which we contemplate the acts of God by which the world was delivered from the powers of sin and death.

On Maundy Thursday, Jesus explained to his disciples the meaning of the events that are about to take place. His crucifixion will not be like any other crucifixion. He will give his body and blood for our salvation. Like washing the disciples' feet, Jesus going to the cross is an act of service for us. At the end of the service, we strip the altar, as Jesus was arrested.

On Good Friday, we remember the crucifixion. There is no Eucharist, because what the Eucharist symbolizes is present on the cross. Although everyone assumed the drama was over at that point, the story doesn't end at the cross or with the burial of Jesus.

On Easter, we experience the surprise of the



Music Notes with Bob Morrison

After visiting the Palace Theater and seeing the non-functioning organ, I feared it was a lost cause. Not so. Steve Brown, of the Schantz Organ firm in Orrville, undertook a labor of love in restoring this gem. And I had a chance to play it for an appearance of the original Countess Maria Von Trapp who was fundraising for a charitable cause she championed. But alas, Steve's good work was ruined by rain leaks.

Canton Jaycees came to the rescue when there was talk of demolishing the theater, and Charles Kegg of Hartville was hired to renovate the Kilgen "wonder organ.". The organ elevator was discarded in favor of a platform that could be raised or lowered, so the organ console could be placed in the center or wherever desired.

I had the good fortune to play preludes for the eight Grand Piano Extravaganzas which Malone's music chair Sandra Carnes initiated. The Palace stage filled with eight Steinways and, for the final piece, three players at each keyboard doing "Stars and Stripes Forever." I chimed in with the organ on the last part.



Bruce Schutrum has provided good information on Steve Brown's memoir and he also tells me that the St. Paul's Episcopal Skinner was 24 ranks of pipes, not 15 as I reported.
